Trustee Board – 2021 Annual Report

2021 was a relatively quiet year for the trustees with the parsonage being empty for half the year and congregation numbers being down due to Alberta Health guidelines the general care and maintenance required was minimal.

Items that had been addressed throughout the year were the replacement of the sign in front of the church with a new one made by Jess Kochendorfer, the elevator annual inspection was completed without issue, the county fire marshal was brought in to assess the church capacity and advised the maximum people allowed upstairs is 160 and downstairs is 137. We were also in contact with an energy broker that looked into costs for the church and parsonage utilities and found that our current providers are in line with other providers and there would be no benefit in changing.

Going forward into the new year there are still a few unfinished projects needing to be addressed. We are still working at finding a contractor and getting estimates to build a room at the back of the church in order to provide an area that will accommodate the live stream video equipment and sound system. The basement floor in the parsonage requires some maintenance in order to make it a more functional space now that the issue of water seeping into the foundation has been taken care of and lastly the area to the north of the parsonage throughout the trees has been overrun with oxeye daisy which was mowed and picked late last fall but was too late for spraying to be effective and will need to be sprayed this year.

Thank you to Aron and James for giving of your time and skills to help in the care and upkeep required to provide this special place God has given for all to come and worship and look forward to Tyler returning to give of his time on the board of trustees once again.
